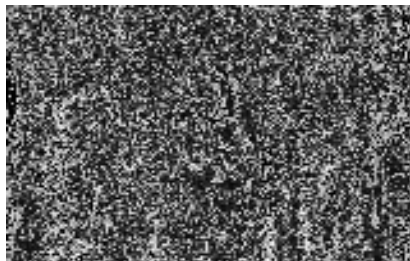

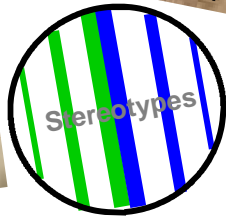
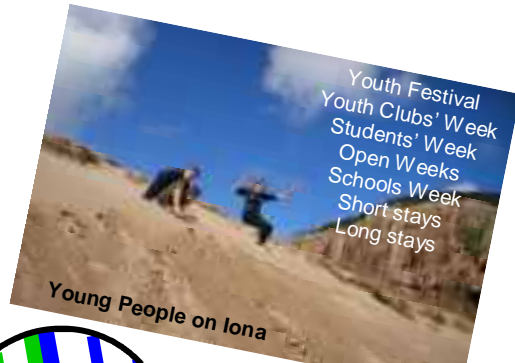

The Island and mainland programme team will work with you to offer a creative programme ranging from justice issues, letter writing campaigns, arts & crafts, pilgrimages, singing, music and drama. Alternatively, bring a group to School's Week, Youth Clubs' Week, Youth Festival, an Open Week or try one of our short stay options.

The MacLeod Centre

The Iona Community's award winning building is designed to help young people, families and people with disabilities celebrate Community together. The spacious, light-filled building sits just up the road from the Abbey and has accommodation for approximately 48 guests in dormitories for five and seven people. Guests and staff come from many

backgrounds, traditions and countries to experience community life together.

Camas Centre—Isle of Mull

Formerly a fishing station and before that quarry workers' accommodation this is the Iona Community's outdoor activity centre. Groups are invited to live in community simply and without the trappings of modern day life. The emphasis is very much on sustainability and living sympathetically with the environment. A half hour walk down a track takes you to this quiet, secluded bay where otters and seals can be seen. We offer kayaking, and abseiling as well as team building activities, arts and crafts as well as guided walks, camping and reflection times. A minimum group number of 10 guests is required.
